

I was thrilled when I got this book. As a new weaver I had books on warping and weaving a sampler. This book helps fill in many holes that more advanced books assume you have. It made me so happy! The author covers everything in detail, it has great photography and doable patterns. She gives you permission to be a pattern weaver yet encourages you to experiment and create your own. Patterns for four shaft looms, also great patterns for smaller looms that many beginners have. Lots of text and instruction helps this new weaver feel confident to give these different weaving patterns a try!

Excellent book in many ways but the description that this book has "overshot, summer and winter, lace, and doubleweave" is inaccurate and misleading. There is no section on doubleweave; the words do not even appear in the glossary or index. Since doubleweave is the PRIMARY reason I bought this book, I am leaving this low star review. To swallow my personal disappointment and be fair to author and the book as a whole, it is excellent for the subjects it does address. Instructions are clear, graphs/pictures are clear, the tone of the writing is pleasant. It is worth the cost of the book as long as you buy it knowing there is no doubleweave section.

This is one of those weaving books that you actually want to read and not just look for projects in. I have only read most of the twill section and I have already made this purchase worth it. Stuff you really maybe just gleaned from where you learned to weave but now it is fully explained. I have learned more from this book already than 4 years weaving and I went to a University for weaving..really. I am so happy I got this book.

Just got this book, so haven't woven anything relevant from it yet-- I'm involved with another project right now--- but the instructions seem very clear and much more detailed info than is usually given in weaving projects. Diagrams are very easy to read, pictures are clear and show what the weave really is supposed to look like. I look forward to sampling soon!

I have been weaving about 4 years. I found this book to be a good review that included many tips I had missed. This will be a go to refresher for various techniques when I need to brush up. Contains some nice projects as well.
